

# Teen, Teen, Goose:

## Creating Whimsy in Your Teen Space



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### Building Identity

#### Why is this important?

- Teens feel welcome
- Teens feel ownership of the space
- Encourages and invites participation in teen programs and events
- Can deter adults from lingering in the teen space

#### What are the benefits?

- Consistent afterschool crowd
- Library is known as a safe and comfortable third space for teens
- Teens become familiar with library staff
- Teens feel cared for and seen

### Passive Programming

**Games :** Uno, puzzles, quick play time is best

**Art Supplies:** Coloring books, origami paper, markers/crayons, passive version of community art projects

**Home Supplies:** Pencils/pens/highlighters, stapler, lined paper, etc.

**Feedback Opportunities:** Feedback sheet on supply shelf & Teen Advisory Group. Supplies can be tailored to the teens' needs and the feedback sheet can be more accessible to shy teens

**Considerations:** Use clear "Teens Only" signage, supplies stay in the teen space. Shelving can also be used to provide a bin of free period supplies for teens.

### Community Art

#### Drip Art Inspired Mural

- Artist Inspiration: Jen Stark
- Large paper, acrylic paint
- Each teen creates one section, then staff assemble final piece on the wall

#### Splatter Paint Extravaganza

- Small and large canvases (individual pieces, community pieces), slightly watered down paint, paintbrushes, toothbrushes
- Do this program outside & use drop cloths!

#### Abstract Paper Collage

- Cardstock, canvases, glue, scissors
- Provide a theme
- Once finished, "puzzle piece" the canvases together on the wall

### Mascots

#### General Mascot Choosing Guidelines

- The sillier, the better! If it seems utterly ridiculous, you're on the right track and the teens will probably like it
- Possible options: porch goose, a stapler with googly eyes, thrifted taxidermy, a silly looking plushie
- If you make a name tag for your mascot, it seems more official.

#### Programming/Mascot Use

- Bracket and voting process to name the mascot
- Mascot themed decor: wall art, incorporate mascot into book displays
- Passive programming: art submissions
- Teen space signage featuring mascot
- Outreach: take the mascot out into the community with you!
